CANDLE LIGHT SHOOT

1. The Candle Light shoot is designed as a fun and entertaining event that challenges shooters beyond what they are accustomed. It is not meant as a serious challenge of standard field target skills. Don't take it too seriously!
2. The Match Director has the right to adjust and change the rules to accommodate weather changes, facility availability, match size, and other unforeseen factors that may be present at the time of the Candle Light Shoot. The Match Director also reserves the right to change the rules just cause he wants to!
3. Match is shot after sundown, and all sunlight has left the sky.
4. Lights will be on as lanes and targets are assigned. Shooters are allowed to get into shooting position, and spot their equipment and pellets before "lights out."
5. Time will be limited a total 4 minutes take a single shot at the three candles assigned to the shooter. At the end of 4 minutes the lights will be turned back on and any shots after the lights go on do not count. A verbal warning will be given at 30 seconds and 10 seconds before the lights are turned on.
6. Shots must not hit the wax on the candle. Wax splatters and candle divots will be counted as a miss even though the candle has been snuffed by the shot.
7. Only Match Director and/or Range Marshals allowed down range to check for wax splatters and candle divots unless given prior permission from Match Director.
8. The distance from the firing line to the candles will be between 25 and 50 yards. It will be the responsibility of the competitor to accurately determine the "target" distance.
9. The trigger must stay behind the firing line.
10. Hunter class competitors must follow all hunter rules (includes shooting stix, bucket seats and scope limits).
11. AAFTA field target rules shall apply for gun, seat, ammunition, and shooting aides.



12. Course of fire shall be 4 sets of three candles for each competitor.
13. Ties will be broken by a shoot-off, as determined by the Match Director.
14. No artificial light allowed mounted on the rifles or shined down range towards the candles.
15. Low level artificial light may be used for locating pellets & loading rifle. Under no circumstances will lights be shined towards or in the eyes of other competitors.
